

Pastel Painting Supply List

Easel.

Drawing board (or ½ inch foam core board that can accommodate the paper you'll use).

Very good selection of pastels (Nupatels set of 96, at least.) The larger the selection the better. You can use other brands as well.

Pastel paper. (Wallis sanded paper I recommend as the best) or UArt sanded pastel paper (Check with Jerry's Artarama in Norwalk, CT) ask for the manager, Joanne Fox. If you can't find either brand try any other brand of sanded pastel paper. (Much better than Canson pastel paper, which I don't recommend).

Turpenoid (odorless turps).

Some bristle painting brushes (different sizes. Don't get expensive ones since the abrasive paper will chew them up). Inexpensive set of chip-brushes are the best. (See photo below.) You can find these at a store like Home Depot.

Roll 1 inch masking tape.

Hair drier.
